This one-act play in Pidgin English is set in a house in Manoa Valley where an elderly couple is living its golden years. The play celebrates the apparently common man and woman next door and shares how uncommonly special they are. Actors William Ha'o and Nan Asuncion bring the play to vibrant life, moving audiences to tears and laughter.

The 45-minute play is followed by a discussion session with the actors, stage manager, playwright, School of Social Work teaching staff and students.

THE LINES ARE DRAWN is written by Manoa playwright Karen Yamamoto Hackler. Karen received a State Foundation on Culture and the Arts Individual Artist Fellowship in Playwriting in 2002. This is the first of two plays in Lo'i Theater's inaugural season called "Golden Light: Celebrating Our Elders."
